

CRAIGIEBURN FOREST

- **Circular woodland walk**
- **4.5km/3 miles**
- **Allow 1 hour**
- **Hard surfaced forest road and beaten earth paths. Gate/stile at start**
- **Moderate**
- **Boots or stout shoes recommended**

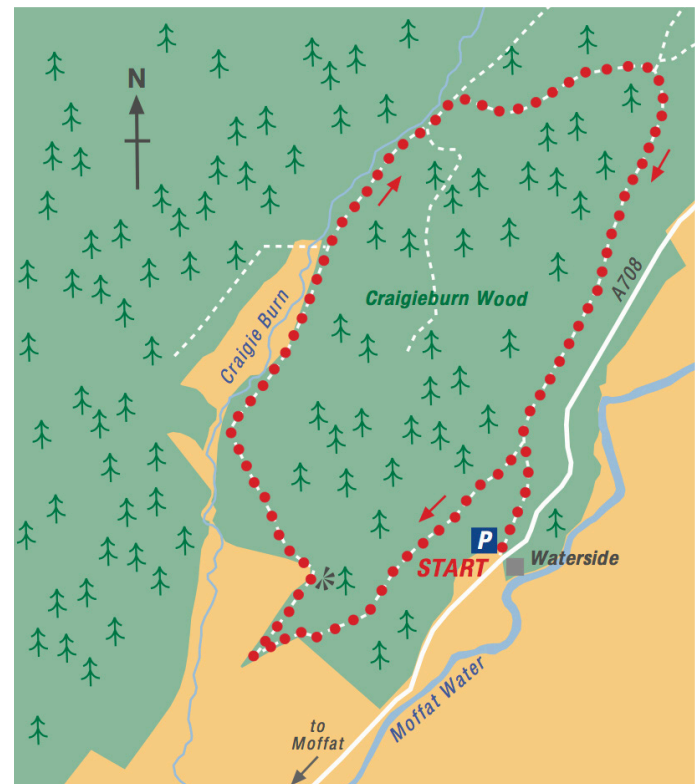
This is the shorter of two walks offered by Forestry Commission Scotland at Craigieburn. Follow the yellow waymarkers for the 6 mile route.

PARKING From the bottom of the Moffat High Street take the A708 Selkirk road. After 2.8 miles you will reach a property on the right called Waterside. Start indicating left for the Forestry Commission Scotland Craigieburn car park.

START Enter Craigieburn on the forest road and turn left at the junction following the red waymarker posts. After a gentle climb followed by a short descent you will reach the road terminus. Take the path to the right (dogs should be leashed from this point) alongside the power lines to join the drystone wall. Look out for the “lunky hole” (purpose built sheep hole) in this section of wall.

The path takes a sharp turn with the wall at a point in the boundary. Turn left at the next corner and you will reach a seat giving good views out through the mouth of Moffat Dale. Continue past the seat to connect with the forest road. Stay on the main forest road, passing one road to the left and one to the right.

From this point you should get a good view along Broken Back to Capel Fell. Turn right at the corner junction and enjoy the winding descent through mixed woodland with views out across Moffat Dale.



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
